As a result, the dimension of moral ambiguity—which is often a strength in realistic novels—is not fully developed. This limits the possibility of richer psychological exploration.

From a stylistic aspect, Tere Liye's language in *Tentang Kamu* is generally simple, communicative, and focused directly on the main events. The choice of words is not too complex, and the sentence structure is clear and straightforward. Because of this, the novel is easy to read and understand for readers from different ages and educational backgrounds. This simplicity becomes a strength, since it allows the moral message and emotional content of the story to be delivered clearly without serious linguistic difficulty. In addition, the natural dialogue helps bring the characters to life and makes the reading pace move smoothly. However, in some parts, the narration becomes repetitive, especially when emphasizing the suffering of the main character. The repeated descriptions of hardship and injustice experienced by Sri Ningsih are effective in building empathy, but they may reduce the dramatic intensity if they are not balanced with variation in conflict or deeper perspectives. In literary criticism, this kind of repetition can create an impression that the story is too didactic or overly direct in delivering its moral lesson. As a result, the reader's space for interpretation becomes more limited. Even so, this approach is consistent with Tere Liye's writing style, which places moral messages at the center of the narrative.

Thematically, the novel shows strong power in raising issues such as social injustice, violence against women and children, the marginalization of vulnerable groups, and the meaning of sincerity in facing a harsh reality. Tere Liye does not present suffering only as a dramatic background, but also as a way to highlight structural problems in society, such as unequal power relations in families, weak social protection, and the fragile position of women in a patriarchal system. These themes are developed consistently throughout the narrative, forming a strong ideological foundation in the novel. However, the moralistic approach, which is delivered quite explicitly through clear statements about goodness, patience, and justice, can be seen as a double-edged sword. On one hand, it makes the ethical message clearer and easier to understand for general readers. On the other hand, for academic readers who value ambiguity and open interpretation, this explicit moral message may limit alternative readings. In other words, the dominance of normative messages can reduce the complexity of interpretation, which is often considered a strength in literary works that are open to multiple meanings.

Tentang Kamu offers a powerful reflection on human endurance and ethical integrity. The novel demonstrates that profound suffering does not inevitably lead to moral decay but can cultivate compassion and wisdom. Sri Ningsih's life story serves as a reminder that true justice is not always achieved through retaliation, but through moral resolve and forgiveness. In conclusion, this book is highly recommended for readers interested in humanistic literature, moral education, and contemporary Indonesian novels. Despite minor limitations in character depth, Tentang Kamu stands as a meaningful literary work that contributes significantly to discussions of humanity and social justice.
